## Is my child too ill for school?

As we are coming into the winter term at school we wanted to share some guidance we have received from the NHS about mild illness.
It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of $38^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ or above.
